<p>At Kington Primary School, our intention for Special Educational Needs and/or Disabilities (SEND) is to ensure that all children receive a high-quality and ambitious education regardless of need or disability. We are an inclusive school that recognises and celebrates pupil's diverse talents and interests. We understand that all pupils are unique individuals and that some children experience some difficulties relating to specific areas of learning. We believe that it is vital that our pupils are equipped with the tools needed to become independent, inquisitive learners both in and out of the classroom. As such, inclusion is a thread that runs through every area of the school enhanced by collaboration between senior leaders, teachers, support staff, external agencies, parents and most importantly, the child.</p> <p>At Kington Primary School, pupils with SEND will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Be included in all aspects of the school day.</li> <li>• Be provided with quality first teaching, differentiated to their needs.</li> <li>• Be respected and their contributions valued and acknowledged.</li> </ul> <p>At Kington Primary School, pupils with SEND may:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Have specific 1:1 or small group intervention to support their Phonics, Maths or Literacy learning.</li> <li>• Take part in social and emotional support interventions such as play therapy, art therapy, forest schools or Nurture interventions.</li> <li>• Receive additional support with their speech and language development from a specialist teaching assistant.</li> <li>• Carry out some of their learning outside of their classroom if a low arousal environment or specialist setting is required to support learning environment is required to support learning.</li> <li>• Work alongside external agencies such as an Educational Psychologist, Speech and Language Therapist, Occupational Therapist or outreach services to develop specific targets/programmes tailored to the child's individual needs.</li> </ul> <p>For children and families impacted by specific needs or disabilities, Kington uses a graduated response model, as identified in the SEND Code of Practice, to identify learning needs and initiate a Support Plan to help pupils overcome their barriers to learning.</p> <p><a href="https://primarysite-prod-sorted.s3.amazonaws.com">C:\Users\adeans\AppData\Local\Temp\mso882F.tmp (primarysite-prod-sorted.s3.amazonaws.com)</a></p>	<p>As a result:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Children at Kington Primary School feel happy, safe and respected.</li> <li>• Children demonstrate high levels of engagement in activities, developing their speaking, listening and social skills.</li> <li>• Children with SEND make good progress at Kington Primary School from their starting points due to the use of resources and small group intervention which meets the needs of the pupils.</li> <li>• On leaving Kington Primary School , children with SEND have developed good independence and life skills.</li> </ul> <p><a href="https://primarysite-prod-sorted.s3.amazonaws.com">Microsoft Word - SEN School Profile Autumn 2022 (primarysite-prod-sorted.s3.amazonaws.com)</a></p>
